The display includes a portfolio with the names of all the approximately 7,300 men of the Leicestershire Regiment who died in The Great War.

NEW: This year the Sikh Museum Initiative a display of Sikh military artefacts and photography from a special collection, including a model of the Sikh soldier statue erected in Victoria Park.


