

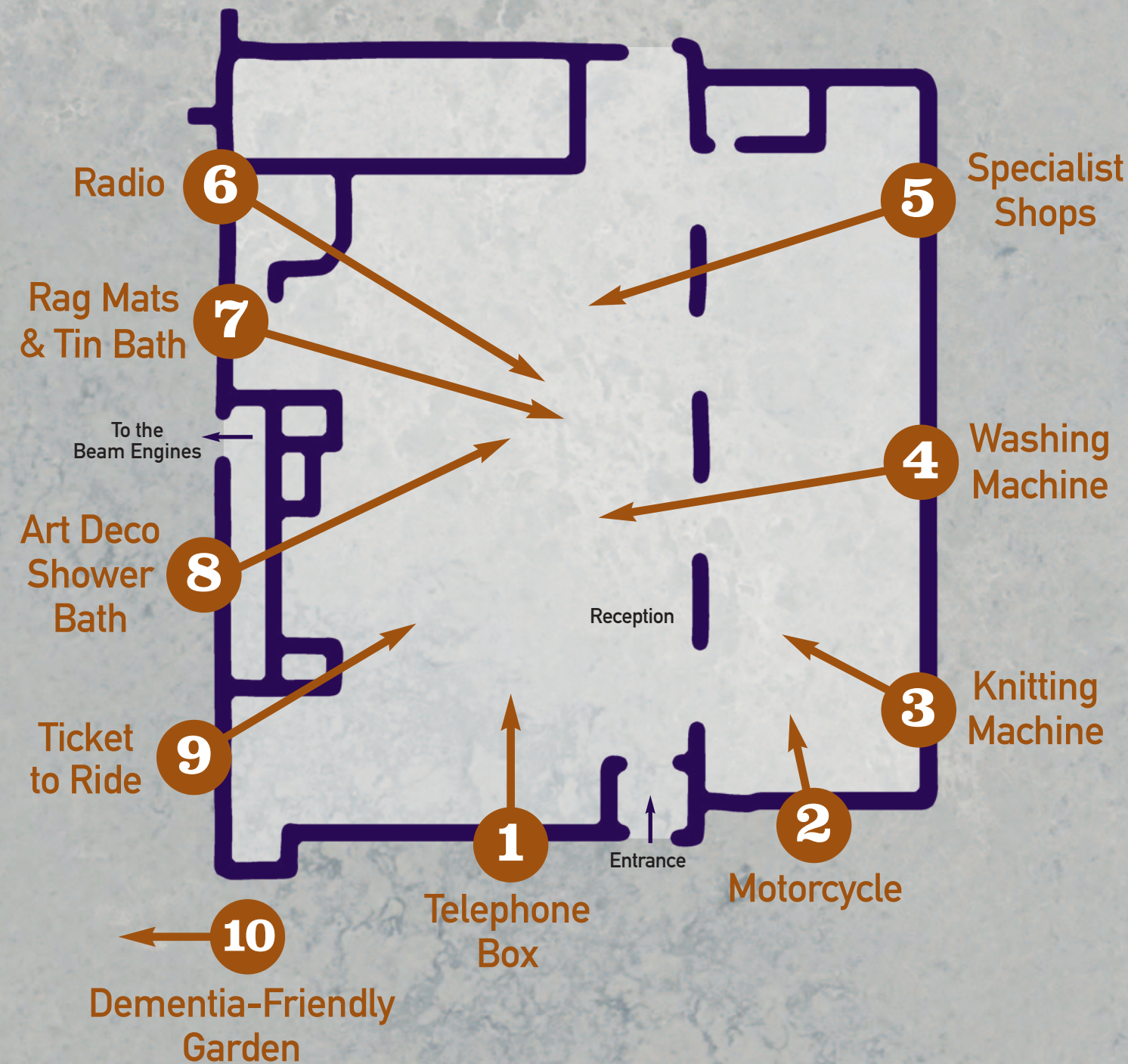
# Welcome...

The objects on this trail have been specially chosen to trigger memories for our older visitors.

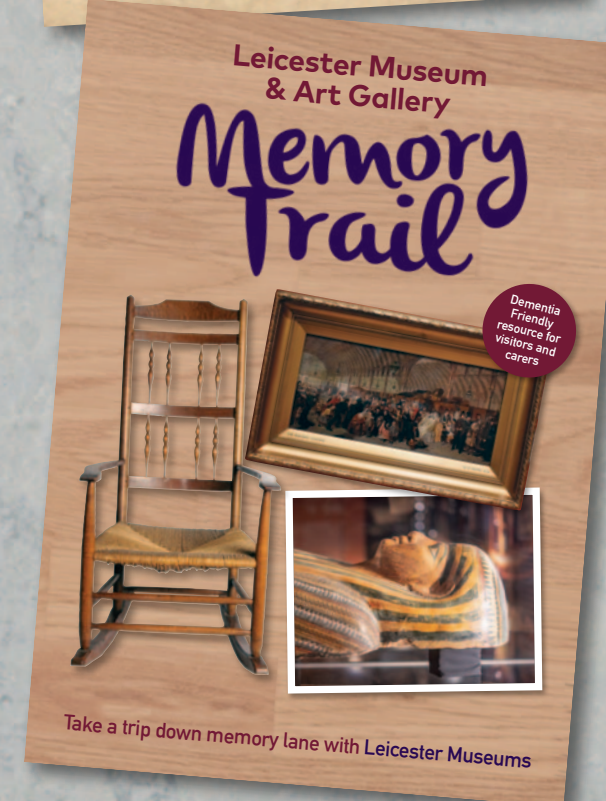
Explore the museum and discover how the objects can start conversations about how people lived and how things have changed over the years.

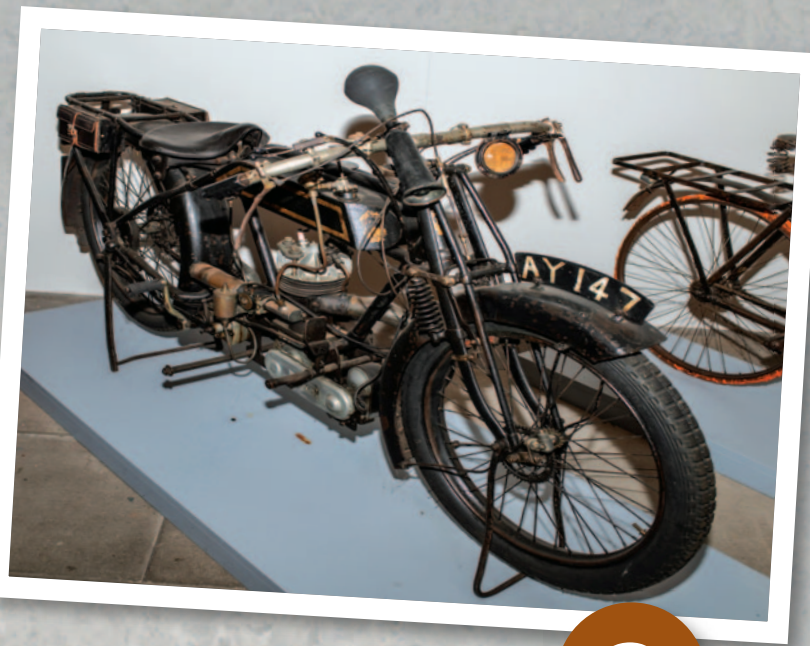

Once a familiar sight, nearly all of these have now been replaced by mobile phones. This phone box now has a new use, it contains a selection of toys from the past.

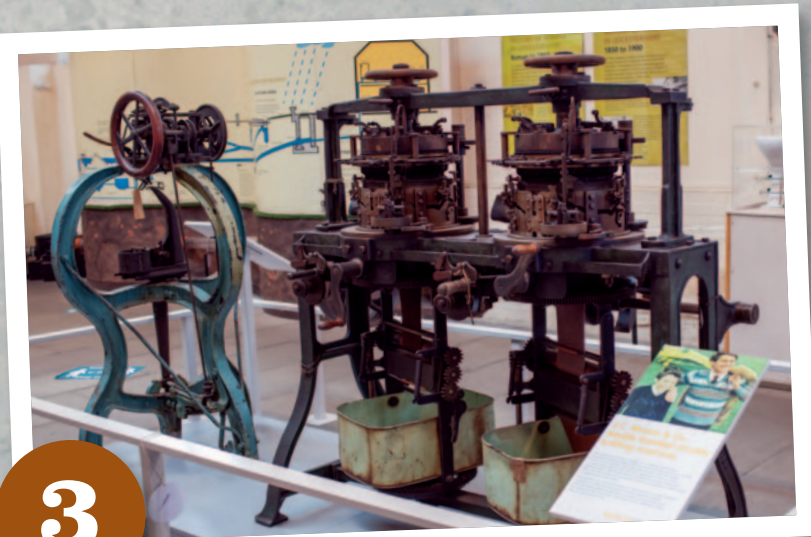
- Did you have a phone in your house when you were a child?

# Motorcycle

Before everyone could afford a car, you were lucky if you had a bicycle with an engine attached or a motorcycle with like this Colonial 500cc Motorcycle from 1914.

- Did your family own a car? Do you remember the policemen directing traffic in the road?
- Indicators popped out sideways on cars in the 50s and early 60s – do you remember drivers in old cars sticking their hand out of the window to signal turning?
- What type of transport did you use when going on a day trip or holiday?

# Knitting Machine

Hosiery in Leicester was a huge business. This doubled headed circular knitting machine is one of thousands that produced knitwear for companies like J. Pick and Sons.

- Did you or anyone you know work in the hosiery business?
- Do you remember the rush at the factory gates to get in and out at the start of the shift and the end of the day?
- Did you have to 'clock in'? Were you ever late for work? What happened?

# Servis Washing Machine

Washing machines became more sophisticated and in the 1960s this one could be purchased at Abbey Electrical Stores who specialised in new and used machines. 'You can't buy better' they said.

- Did you have a washing machine? What kind? A twin tub or boiler? What about a mangle?
- Before dryers everyone pegged their washing on a line. Did your Mum hang washing in the entry?
- Was there a special washday at your house? Did washing get put out on a Sunday?

# Specialist Shops

Nowadays, you can buy everything at big superstores. But back in the old days, each retailer had its own special outlet, from butchers to bicycle shops.

- Where did you shop for things when you were younger?
- How often did you shop for fresh food, daily, weekly?
- Do you remember queuing for the butchers?
- What about shoes – do you remember Rowbothams on Belvoir Street with the big rocking horse?

- What was it like to have to go outside to the toilet in winter?

Before buses, trams were the way to get around town. Leicester had a large-scale tramway that lasted until 1949. The model is of an open top tram car.

- Have you ever ridden on a tram? Was it very different to taking a bus?
- Do you remember a bus conductor with his ticket machine? The little coloured card tickets had numbers – as a child did you look for 'lucky numbers' on your ticket?
- Where did you sit on the bus? On the back seat? Upstairs by the big window at the front?
- Do you remember how smoky it was upstairs on the bus?
