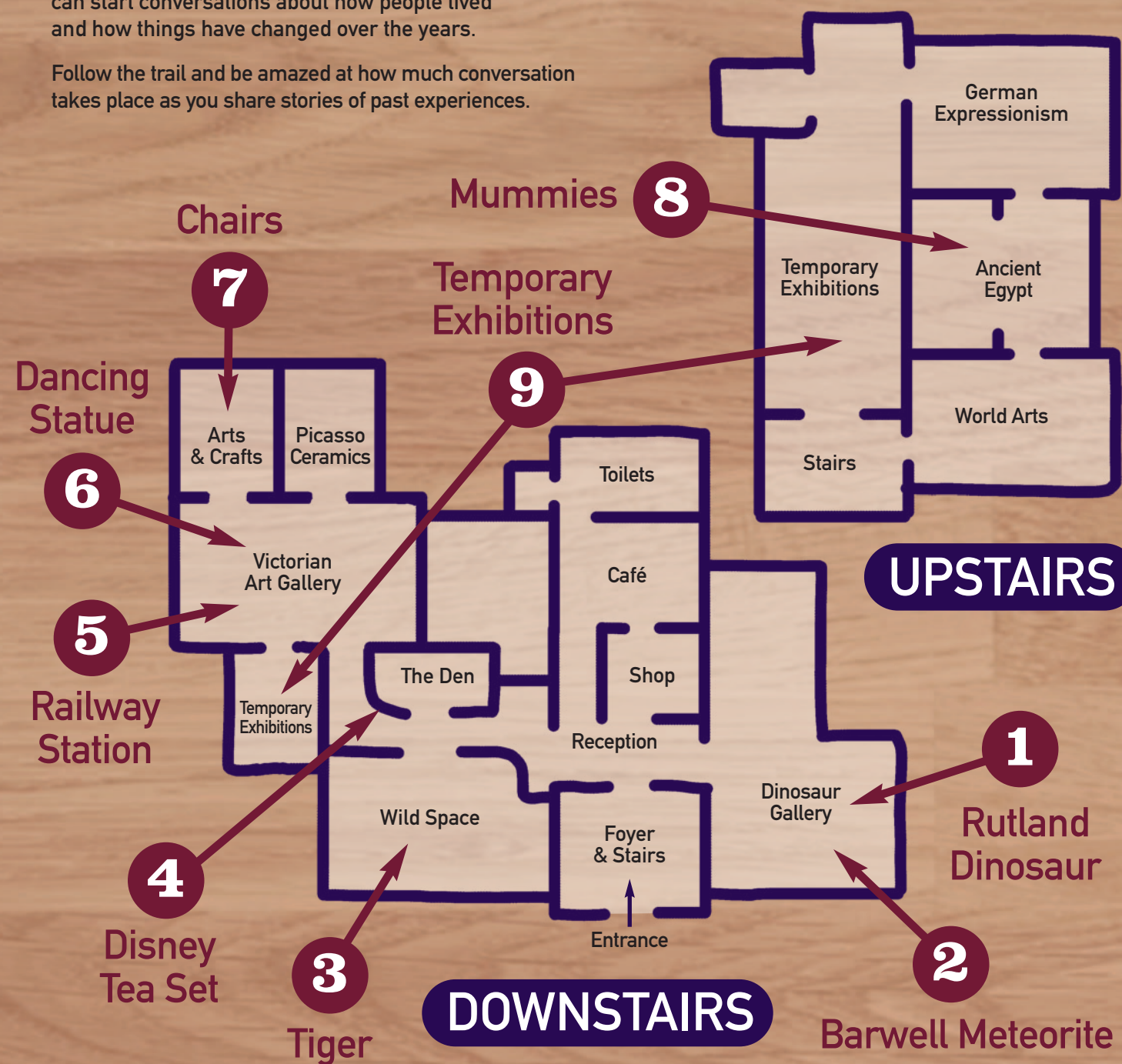
to the Leicester Museum & Art Gallery Memory Trail

The objects on this trail have been specially chosen to trigger memories for our older visitors.

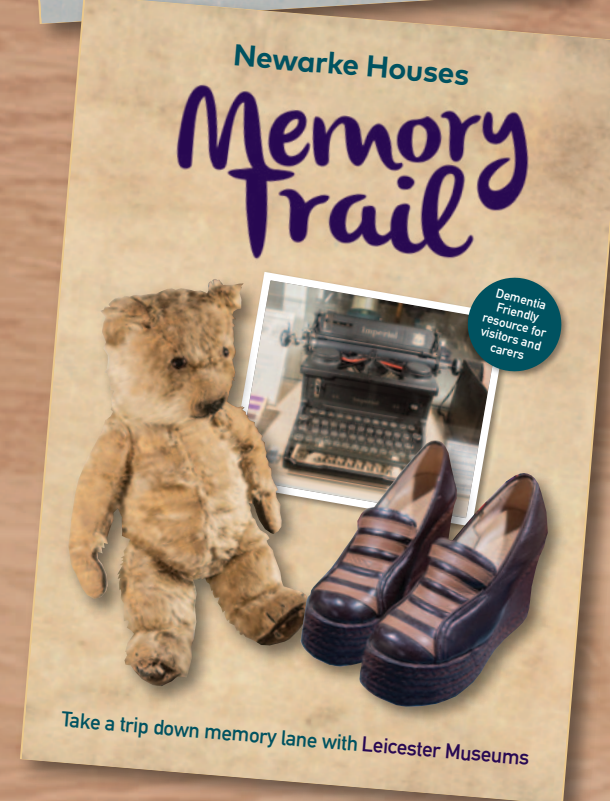
Explore the museum and discover how the objects can start conversations about how people lived and how things have changed over the years.

The Rutland Dinosaur

- What type of paintings or objects do you like? Are they landscapes, pictures of people or interesting objects?



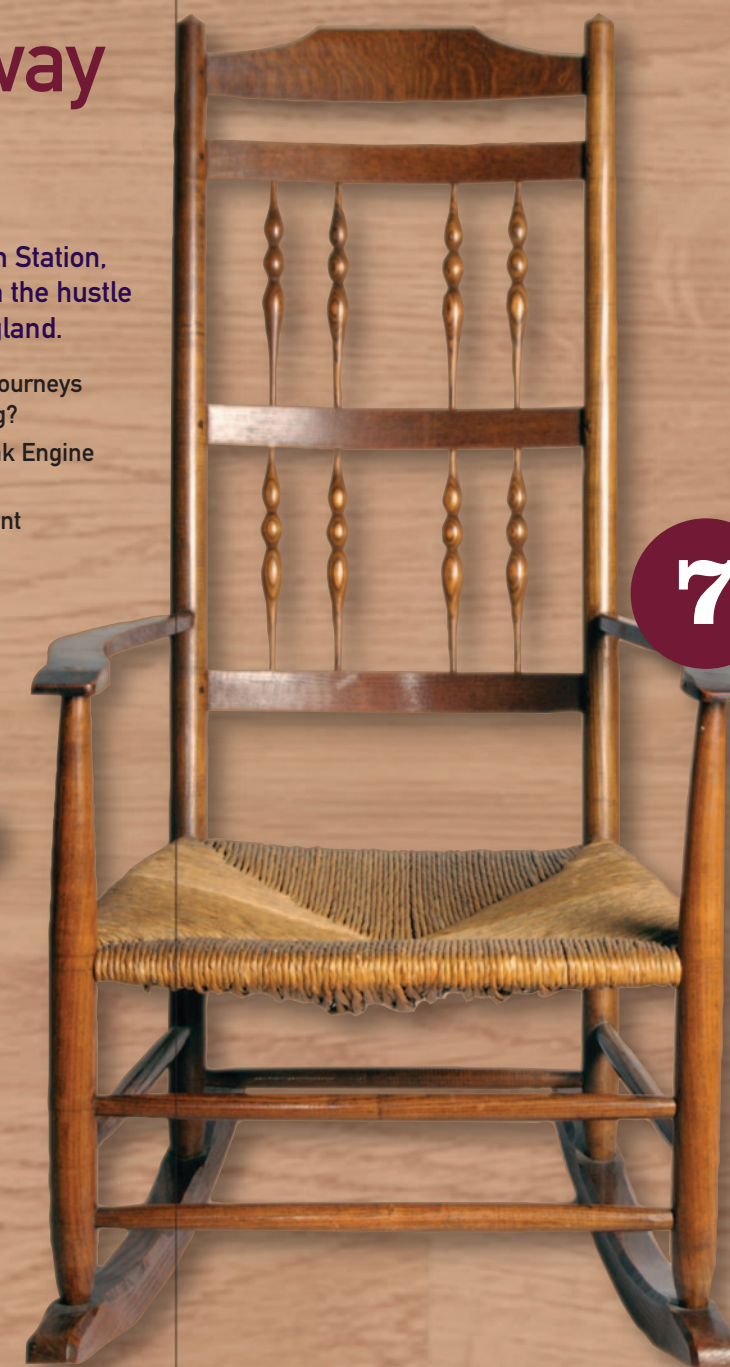

Barwell Meteorite

Museums contain objects that are very old and this one is the oldest object in the Museum collection. Some objects are discovered by members of the public like this one found in 1968 on an allotment!
